

In July 4th, 2019, the PLVB has fulfilled another goal with the launch of the Excellence Guide in Sustainability: Best Practices for Freight Transport, the third in an annual series of bilingual publications that started in 2017 with the Reference Guide in Sustainability: Best Practices for Freight Transport, followed by the Application Handbook: Best

Practices for Freight Transport in 2018. These initiatives aim at reaching the establishment of the Accreditation System for the Green Seal in Logistics, scheduled to be implemented in 2020.

With 172 participants from 120 companies, the event was a success and included the presentation of posters with success cases

of Member Companies, a lecture on "Logistics sustainability: a global view on infrastructure dependence" given by the World Bank's delegate, and a debate on "Infrastructure, Economy, a Visions for the Future and the Green Seal" held between delegates of BNDES, the World Bank, the Brazilian Panel on Climate Change and NTC & Logistics.

Meeting the growing demand for specific formation in the area of logistics sustainability, the PLVB offered two training opportunities in April and June of 2019. With classes of about 20 students, the PLVB Training presented and consolidated concepts of logistics and sustainability through practical application and real cases. This knowledge enables professionals of different areas to meet the new demands of logistics management around the world and, especially, to guarantee the knowledge needed for their companies to better position themselves regarding the establishment of the Accreditation System for the Green Seal
